1. Welcome and Introductions:

The chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, Introductions around the table.

2. Previous notes/actions:

3. Homelessness:

AC update we are looking at homelessness and addressing issues, telephone help line seems a concern; I am in contact with the housing dept.

Suggestions:

McDonalds are open 24hrs

Women's Aid- work with P3 and A-Hag

Night stop- Volunteers house 18-25 yr olds for 1 month available locally to Aylesbury Vale

There is no one to contact out of hours for a place of safety for homelessness within BCC.

- Action: AA to send link to AC to circulate to attendees to complete survey by 1st April so group can share thoughts on homelessness provision.
- Action: AC to highlight back to housing dept the concerns raised.
- Action: AC to liaise with Bucks comms to coordinate information to be circulated for OOH contacts for those with homelessness challenges.
- Action: SS As temporary chair of IAG to send letter representing all of IAG to the housing manager BCC re: gaps in out of hours and communication on Homelessness.

4. Hate Crime Data and Discussion- update

Work happening around hate crime, waiting on framework and formalisation of reference it is a priority.

5. LPA Commanders Updates:

20/12/2021-01/02/2022 – Operation Arable

Developing series encompassing 15 rural crimes by a group of 5-6 males attending predominantly rural farm locations and stealing high value caravans, horse boxes and trailers and presenting significant violence to police. This team of individuals are believed to travel from the Warwickshire area and have committed offences in Northamptonshire, Aylesbury Vale and Bedfordshire. Seven males have been arrested following one incident and a joint investigation between Thames Valley Police, Northamptonshire and Bedfordshire is currently ongoing, whereby we are sharing visual evidence and investigative material with the overall objective of securing conspiracy charges for all the offences. This holistic approach increases the likelihood of securing charges for a theft conspiracy. Those made are on police bail with conditions.

- 23/01/2022 - Waddesdon Protests - Operation Austin -

A protest by an anti-satanic abuse group (Survivors of Satanic Ritual Abuse) against the Rothschild Family. Two of the organisers were arrested in advance of the protest in relation to conspiracy/incitement to murder the residents of the manor, both are on police bail. 50 persons attended for the protest and they proceeded onto the grounds, completed speeches and then left peacefully. The two individuals arrested and are currently on bail conditions which we are monitoring whilst further enquiries continues.

- 02/02/2022 - HS2-

A suspect package was located on the perimeter fence by security during a patrol of the site. There was a full Police and Bomb Disposal response to the device. The item was assessed and found to be a discarded mobile phone battery and charger. The investigation into a device that was lit and thrown under a HS2 vehicle was filed NFA yesterday, no forensics or suspects identified.

- 28/02/2022 –

Lighting of the Paralympic Torch Ceremony Beijing 2022. The Chinese Ambassador attended with a number of dignitaries and 30 supporters brought with them. The High Sherriff of Bucks along with the BCC representatives and other community leads present. There were no issues or protests but significant attendance from a number of high-level dignitaries from China.

Court Results:

Daniel WISNEWSKI-Grand Union Canal Murder April 2021 outcome- Wisnewski was found guilty of murder and sentenced to a minimum 35 years. A further hearing since has confirmed his true identity as being Sylwester Krajewski who is a convicted murderer from Poland having killed a married couple in 1992, was sentenced to 25 years imprisonment before he absconded from prison in 2005 and has been on the run ever since.

6. Members Feedback / Issues to raise:

Electric scooters were discussed along with cyclists, some that could be discussed on a future agenda. Mixed views. Agreed this may tie in with refresh of the IAG and what is relevant.

SS- mentioned the IAG strategic meeting and annual conference if any members were interested, ZFB will resend email with details.

This is with a view to supporting them and being alive to the risk of increased hate crime and community tensions. Representation on the IAG from both communities would be valuable. RM will build on this with Neighbourhood Policing engagement/support.

Youth Concern have a drop in centre where people can do the following: music recording, martial arts and cooking, there is a sexual health walk in twice a week, also counselling programmes available 20 weeks FOC.
