



**4. LPA Commanders Updates (Superintendent Loebenberg):**

[JH] We continue to see a notable increase in rural crime, there have been several incidents involving Hare Coursing over the last few months. Officers from Aylesbury and Wing responded and some offenders were apprehended. Fly tipping is on the increase, as is trespassing on private land and having dogs out of control around livestock.

[Michael Loebenberg] We understand the impact of rural crime and we have rural teams focussed on the issues but we are limited as to what we can do after the fact. It is really important to report concerns fast time so that we can look to get there during the action.

Following the Policing Uplift Thames Valley Police received 183 additional officers in the first year and Aylesbury Vale received 16 of these. These officers were allocated to our Response teams. In year two no additional officers will be provided to the Local Police Areas but will instead be invested in specific targeted areas, such as rural crime. 18 officers will form a Rural Crime Task Force to combat organised criminality. The task force will target five rural police areas, however, Aylesbury Vale has the lowest number of reported rural crimes (crimes recorded per head of population) and as such we would not expect to see a huge uplift in the area.

[SS] Fly tipping is also an issue around Berryfields and surrounding areas. You can sometimes get an address from within the rubbish and the Council are very good at following up on this information.

More police patrols are required during school holidays. There have been reports of ASB and damage and an increased Police presence would help with this. Wing Police Team are very good; with excellent contacts and visibility, however, we need better contact with those based at Waddesdon.

**ACTION: James Davies to share contact information for the Waddesdon Team. (Complete)**

Zipp E-Scooters (the yellow Council affiliated ones) are an increasing issue. They all appear to be being used on the pavement and many do not give way to pedestrians. They are supposed to be driven in the road only. Cyclists already cause issues for pedestrians.

**ACTION: This is a formal scheme being tested in Aylesbury as part of a Government test process. AC to take the issues back to Highways and the Community Safety Partnership.**

[CP and CP] would be very interested in knowing more about Op Accomplish. Women's Aid and SAS work closely with Thames Valley Police and it would be good to forge better relationships and coordinate responses.
