Minutes/actions

- 1. Welcome, apologies, protocol and declaration of interest:** **IAG Chair**
 ET welcomed the attendees to the meeting. The list of apologies / attendees is above.

2. Minutes and actions from previous meeting:**All**

The minutes from the meeting on 15th March were reviewed. The below actions were carried forward to the next meeting on September 27th.

ACTION: RB to share/discuss Policing Commentary Team's brief responses to the landmark reports from the Police Foundation and HMIC.

ACTION: ES to forward details of Pinewood motorcycle meet.

ACTION: KC to add Violence against Women and Girls to the agenda.

ACTION: AC to forward S&S data prior to next scheduled meeting date.

ACTION: AC to present a breakdown of taser data. To include links/relation to mental health issues.

ACTION: JC to check whether dip samples of taser use can be shared with IAG focus groups.

3. Overview of crime and policing issues including Stop & Search and Hate Crime Data and Discussion**All**

HK advised a tasking meeting had occurred earlier in the day discussing priorities and crime issues on the LPA. The main priorities discussed were: 1.) Rape & Sexual Offences, 2.) Knife Crime and 3.) Domestic Violence and Anti-social Behaviour. HK presented an overview of recent recorded crime figures to the members.

4. Critical Incident Review (if appropriate)**LPA Commander**

5. Policing Anti-Social Behaviour in Bracknell (Engagement & Problem Solving)**All**

HK advised there had been a general increase in ASB offences with 142 calls received over the past months. 90 were identified as community ASB, 22 as environmental and 30 as personal (directed at a specific person). Our LPA ranked 7th out of the 12 across TVP. The number of reported ASB related issues in Sandhurst has dropped. A large number of previous reports were related to 4 households in a specific street and warning letters recently sent to them appear to have had a positive effect. The Problem Solving and Neighbourhood Policing teams work closely with partner agencies to understand, address and put plans in place to deal with ASB and other community issues. Early intervention work is key to solving and resolving community issues.

ACTION: HK to look at how to encourage the community to report crime.

6. End of Year Performance Review**LPA Commander**

HK presented an overview of the Force Performance Group Review of Operational Priorities.

7. Any Other Business

Update on Wokingham Bike Thefts – ET advised he had written to the Head of both British Transport Police (BTP) and Network Rail and had received positive feedback that they are focussing on the situation in Wokingham.

Update on Rape in Bracknell in late April – It was suggested the Partnership/Safeguarding Board could put messages out advising what help is available following concerns over national schemes offering help for victims. ET suggested that PB drive this forward.

ACTION: PB to look at forming a Communications, Engagement and Prevention subgroup of the Partnership Board.

Update on anti-social driving – this was carried forward to the next meeting.

ASB in Sandhurst – Covered in agenda item 5.

On Patrol - feedback – HK advised TVP are looking at standardising the process for Ride-A-Longs.

WS wanted to thank TVP for assisting the previous day with a gravel incident where the police stopped traffic to allow the Council to clear the road and felt it was a great response.
