This annual award is named after the late John Latham, a solicitor who worked tirelessly in the field of domestic abuse. After the murders of Julia and William Pemberton in Hermitage in 2003, John supported the family using the Human Rights Act to campaign for the introduction of Domestic Homicide Reviews so that lessons could be learnt from such tragic events to help prevent future deaths.
